When did you join CMAI?

I joined CMAI in October 2012 as the Secretary of the Mid India Board of Education of NL of CMAI. Later, appointed as Section Secretary of the Nurses League in August 2021.

Did you have exposure to Mission Hospitals before joining CMAI?

Yes. I have studied and also worked at CMC Vellore. Followed by Christian Hospital Bissamcuttack in Odisha and for several months at BMCH Alipur as well.

Were you involved in any CMAI activities during this period?

Yes. I was Treasurer for the local unit of NL at CHB Odisha. Regional Nurses Sectional Secretary, Odisha Region for a term.

I was also on the Community Health Committee of CMAI for a term. Attended a Biennial Conference held at Shillong, Meghalaya and Regional Conferences in Odisha.

What are the activities that you are focusing on presently as Nurses League of CMAI?

Education and capacity building has been our strength as nurses league. Formal programs are done through the Boards of NL (MIBE and BNESIB). We also coordinate informal programs like short courses and webinars.

We have completed 7 batches of Ward Managers Training which empowers second-line leaders in clinical areas. The highlight of this training is a one-week exposure to CMC Vellore in their areas of choice. They learn best practices during their experience there. We recently coordinated a short course on 'Refresher Course on Palliative Care for Nursing Faculty'. More such courses are in the pipeline. Leadership and Mentorship program is another area that we are working on.

We hope to connect the young nurse leaders with senior nurse leaders who can guide and mentor them, especially in mission hospitals.

We will also have regular sessions on leadership skills. Networking with like-minded organizations and policy engagement through CCH are also amongst the ongoing activities.

What are your plans for the forthcoming months?

Skill building is another area that we are looking at for our nurses working in mission hospitals. We are exploring different models.

We are planning to utilize retired clinical experts. Membership Strengthening is another area we are looking into, updating our inactive members and reaching out to nurses working in the private and government sectors. Short Courses in collaboration with foreign universities is another project that we are working on, and we hope to start in the first quarter of the new year.

What are the challenges you face in implementing various programs?

Motivating nurses to join courses and programs from our mission hospitals is a big challenge. Investing in our staff for personal and professional development directly contributes to the organization. It is also the need of the hour to keep up to date with trends and developments in one's field of work.

What is the recent activity you were part of? Please share.

The CMAI Odisha Regional Conference at Christian Hospital Bissamcuttack. It was a very good time of meeting with all our members. The keynote address was well appreciated by the participants.

We also discussed about shaping a caring culture in organizations, retaining HR, the role of the church in substance abuse, an engaging group discussion and we had a senior member who spent his lifetime in missions share his journey with us.

Overall, it was a fruitful and refreshing experience. It was organized by our member institution so well and everyone enjoyed the fellowship. ■

SCHOOL HEALTH CHECK-UP

CMAI received a request from THE Mount Carmel School IN Delhi to conduct a comprehensive medical check-up for their students.

Mount Carmel School aims to prioritise the health and safety of their students by implementing regular medical check-ups. The objective is to identify any potential health concerns at an early stage, provide necessary interventions, and foster a healthy learning environment. With two senior schools and four junior schools, Mount Carmel has approximately 5000 students.

The requested medical check-up services include:

1. General Health Assessments: Thorough screenings to evaluate the overall health status of the students.
2. Vision and Hearing Tests: Assessments to identify any potential visual or auditory impairments that could impact learning or daily activities.

3. Dental Examinations: Check-ups to ensure oral health and identify any dental issues requiring treatment.



...providing necessary interventions, and foster a healthy learning environment for the next generation.

4. Height and Weight Measurements: Assessments to monitor growth and address any concerns related to nutrition and development.

5. Issuance of Health Certificates: Each student will receive a certificate containing their health information.

The Doctors Section has been actively involved in the planning, coordination, and allocation of resources and has developed the format for the health check-up that fulfils the school's requirements.

Additionally, the Doctors Section has prepared the cost estimation and defined the roles and responsibilities of each organization based on the specific needs.

Both parties have agreed upon the terms, and the health check-up will commence in the second week of July as planned. ■


