# The National Conference of the Doctors Section of CMAI

The National Conference of the Doctors Section began on November 21st with an evening dedicated to building connections and community. Starting at 6:00 PM, participants engaged in an Informal Evening and Fellowship session, which provided an opportunity for attendees to network, share experiences, and build professional relationships and have fellowship. This was followed by a Fellowship Dinner, offering a relaxed environment for continued interactions and fellowship. Day two of the Conference (National Conference of the Doctors Section 22nd) presented the most comprehensive schedule, beginning with a morning Worship & Devotion session led by Dr Bobby John.

He opened the devotion by acknowledging that everyone present was there by divine invitation, not by accident. He began with Psalm 137, relating the current gathering to the Rivers of Babylon, and led the group in singing "Amazing Grace" despite the absence of a formal worship team.

Dr Bobby explored the theme of "Perfect Peace" through six Old Testament scripture portions. He illustrated the nature of peace using the analogy of a chair with a short leg: Just as a chair with an uneven leg creates constant instability and discomfort, our lives without active pursuit of peace remain unstable. Simply accepting the wobbling chair (passive peace) isn't the solution -

action is needed to fix the imbalance. The devotion concluded with the promise to explore six New Testament passages the following day, emphasising that peace is an outcome of living people working with God's Spirit to bring stability to inherently unstable situations.

Dr Rajeev Joy Nathan, Chairperson of Doctors Section of CMAI welcomed delegates to the National Conference. His address emphasised that the gathering represented more than a professional conference, but rather a community united by faith and dedication to healing.

A significant highlight was the Keynote Address on the theme of the Conference titled "Perfect Peace" by Dr John C Oommen lovingly known as Johnny. Dr Johnny opens his address by confronting the challenging context of discussing peace amid global turmoil. Referencing ongoing conflicts in Ukraine, Palestine, and Manipur, he draws upon Karl Barth's principle of holding "the Bible in one hand and the Newspaper in the other," emphasising the necessity of bridging faith with contemporary reality rather than retreating into spiritual isolation.

Plenary Session-1, featuring an important clinical discussion on Leprosy Care. This session, led by Dr Helen Roberts and Dr Reeti Tiwari from the Leprosy Mission, covered current treatment

protocols, challenges, and advancements in leprosy management. The afternoon began with Plenary Session-2, where Dr Alen Thomas presented on Recent Advances in Medical Education, covering new teaching methodologies and trends in medical training and shared about the kind of certificate courses or fellowships currently being offered by various online academic institutions.

The Annual General Meeting encompassed several key initiatives and updates. The meeting highlighted CMAI's commitment to medical education through monthly webinars and virtual conferences. A significant focus was placed on the training of the Community Health Entrepreneurs, and project with Healing Fields Foundation, particularly women in rural villages, who receive certification in emergency and first aid care. The meeting also addressed the section's expanding presence, including collaboration with ICMDA for the development of self-learning modules for healthcare managers in Africa, South America, and smaller European and South Asian nations. Important updates include the formation of regional rapid response teams for disaster response, improvements planned in communication strategies, and the implementation of a new membership database system to enhance connectivity among members.

Dr Mary DCruz presented a paper on Perfect Peace and Mental Health esp. for women's health. The presentation explored the delicate balance between achieving peace and managing mental health in healthcare professionals' lives. Dr Mary illustrated how excessive efforts to attain peace often become counterproductive, using relatable examples to demonstrate this paradox. The presentation particularly emphasised sleep as the cornerstone of mental health, recommending 7-8 hours of quality rest and addressing common sleep disturbances. The presentation concluded by advocating for a balanced approach to peace through spiritual practices and practical self-care routines, offering healthcare professionals actionable steps to maintain their mental wellbeing while serving others.

The final day, November 23rd, maintained the spiritual start with Worship & Devotion led by Dr Bobby John.

In the concluding devotion session, Dr Bobby John beautifully tied together the six promises from the New Testament, emphasizing the profound peace that can be found in God's word. Each scripture highlighted a unique aspect of peace, providing a comprehensive understanding that is both comforting and empowering for believers.

The morning featured Plenary Session-3 by Dr Kevin leads on Setting up Tele Medicine, a particularly relevant topic in modern healthcare delivery. The comprehensive session explored the dramatic evolution of telehealth services, particularly during the COVID-19 pandemic, where consultations significantly increased. Dr Kevin details practical aspects of telemedicine implementation, including infrastructure requirements, cost considerations (ranging from 30,000 to 80,000 for equipment), and the successful integration of rural healthcare centers with larger hospitals. He emphasises the particular success in specialties like Neurology, Psychiatry, and Dermatology, while addressing crucial aspects of patient care, ethical considerations, and quality assurance in virtual healthcare delivery.

Plenary Session-4, was led by Dr John C Oommen, focused on "Exploring the Direction of Christian Healthcare," examining crucial aspects such as the balance between speed and direction in the context of management of Christian healthcare institutions, the influence of senior voices in healthcare, and the role of mission hospitals in modern healthcare delivery. The session incorporated powerful storytelling elements and metaphors to illustrate the challenges and opportunities in Christian healthcare.

The conference was structured to effectively combine professional development, clinical education, spiritual elements, networking opportunities and fellowship creating a comprehensive experience among the christian healthcare professionals and participants. ■

# 19th Administrators National Conference of the Administrators' Section

John Thekkekkara, Associate Director, St. John's Medical College Hospital, on "Newer Avenues for Mission Healthcare," and Prof. Lucky Warbah, Principal, College of Nursing, Dr. H. Gordon Roberts Hospital, on being "Ambassadors for Christ in the Healing Ministry." The conference concluded with a Communion Service led by Rev. Thensem Singson and Rev. G.W. Chen,

With its enriching discussions, expert insights, and opportunities for networking, the 19th Administrators National Conference was a resounding success, setting the stage for enhanced leadership and governance in mission healthcare. ■

# 73rd National Conference of the Nurses League of CMAI

The 73rd National Conference of the Nurses League of CMAI, held from December 4th to 6th at AGLC, Hyderabad, was a significant event attended by 101 participants from 18 States and one Union Territory. The conference brought together nurses from 25 CMAI Member Institutions, both public and private sectors, fostering a diverse and enriching environment. The theme of the conference was same as the Healing Ministry theme of CMAI for this year "Perfect Peace." The devotions on the first and third day led us into meaningful reflections from the word of God.

The conference commenced with an inaugural program featuring Dr. Samson Sujit Kumar Gaddam as the Chief Guest. In his keynote address, he emphasized the importance of achieving perfect peace for the body, mind, and soul.

A highlight of the conference was the "Lead like Jesus" encounter seminar, which was well-received by the participants. The session emphasized that we must not edge God out of our lives but exalt Him through our lives. The seminar delved into the transformative power of Jesus's

being and doing habits, inspiring participants to live, love, and lead like Him. The conference also included uplifting singing and testimony sessions, providing opportunities to witness God's faithfulness in various ways. Home group meetings facilitated meaningful connections and prayer support among participants. # 15th Chaplains' Section National Conference

The 15th Chaplains Section National Conference, organized by the Christian Medical Association of India (CMAI), was held from October 23 to 25, 2024, at Hotel Jai in Kodaikanal. This event brought together chaplains, theological students, and pastors from across South India, providing a unique opportunity for reflection, faith enrichment, and networking. With 31 attendees, including CMAI staff, the conference centered on the theme "Perfect Peace," drawing inspiration from Ephesians 2:14 and focusing on the significance of peace in both personal and societal contexts.

The conference began early, with participants arriving for registration. The opening Praise & Worship session set a spiritual tone for the day. Dr. Priya John, General Secretary of CMAI, warmly welcomed attendees and introduced the conference's objectives, inviting reflection on peace throughout the sessions. The keynote address, delivered by Rev. Raja, Chaplain at CMC, emphasized both the personal

and societal dimensions of peace. He challenged attendees to consider how peace can be nurtured in their lives and communities. He explored the role of peace within family dynamics, highlighting its foundational role in emotional and spiritual well-being, especially in healing processes.

The final session of the day, "Perfect Peace – Healing through Amputation," was led by Rev. Devadoss, Senior Chaplain at SIH-R & LC, Karigi-

change on global, national, and local level. The session underscored the crucial role of nurses in addressing this issue and encouraged the adoption of measures to mitigate environmental damage and combat climate change.

d. The session on "Revolutionizing Health Care- The Impact of AI on Nursing Practice" explored the potential of AI in enhancing the quality and efficiency of patient care. The session highlighted how AI can be leveraged to prioritize tasks, save time, and deliver highly effective care. The Annual General Meeting of the Nurses League, held on December 6th, Chaired by Mrs. Mercy Quila, involved the approval of previous meeting minutes, a moment of remembrance for departed members, and the presentation of reports from both Boards of the Nurses League. 33 members and 39 non- members were present.

Awards were presented to students from both NL Boards - BNESIB and MIBE - for their overall outstanding performance in nursing courses. The conference concluded with a valedictory program featuring Dr. Lavanya Suneetha as the Chief Guest. Prizes were awarded for the best NL units at the institutional level, institutions with the highest number of new members, bible quiz, scientific paper and poster presentations, and the poster and reel competition on patient safety conducted by the Kerala region of CMAI.

Overall, the three-day conference provided a rich platform for fellowship, knowledge sharing, and personal growth. Participants found the serene and refreshing ambiance of the venue to be particularly conducive to learning and reflection. ■

Followed by the sessions was the AHP Annual General Assembly, around 30 AHP Members were present for the AGM. The meeting presided by AHP Section Chairperson Mr Paul Patrick Brown, Ms Ancy Ben Zacharia was appointed as the recording secretary, the meeting started with opening prayer by Mr Saroj Kumar Sahu. The agenda was approved, two names were mentioned for the Obituary Dr Ramu Ranadive and Dr Robert H Carman, Father Sijo Kunnel prayed for the departed souls and the bereaved family. The first AHP Executive meeting of the newly elected executive members was conducted on 13th March 2024 through online zoom platform. He mentioned that the Diakonie Gemran language training project initiated through the AHP section. 64 new members joined in the section in the last one year, he also pointed out that the focus of the section will be on increasing the membership, recognition of courses and continuous education. In the regional sectional secretaries report Ms Ancy Ben Zacharia presented her regions report she listed out the different programs conducted in Kerala region with the help of Mr Sanjith Abraham, Kerala Region coordinator.

The assembly suggested to constitute an award in the name of Dr Robert H Carman, as a tribute to his contributions for the Laboratory training Committee and DMLT handbook. The secretary thanked the members for joining and the Vice Chair Mr Jaideep Masih did the closing prayer.
