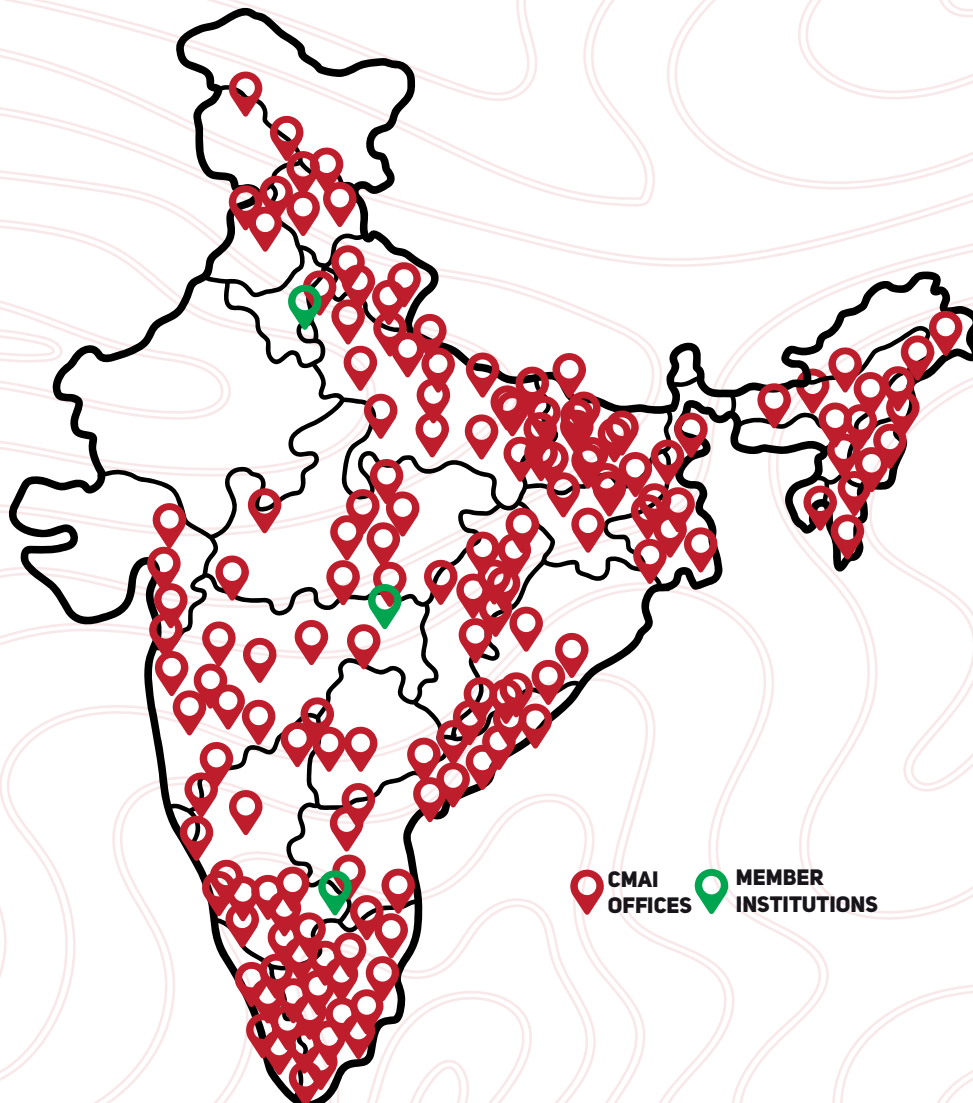
Our Mission

At the National Conferences, the participation of individual members is around 70% , from the Regional Conferences held this biennium showed that in the 13 regions, the total number of participants was 990 out of which 292 were CMAI individual members, with 101 institutional members represented.

Bringing together healthcare professionals as individuals and institutions to share their experiences and learn from each other is the uniqueness of CMAI. 'Missions IsPossible Initiative' is being launched during our General Assembly in Nov 2025 and we aim to take this forward as a project to uphold, recognise and empower our individual members working in mission hospitals and the church leadership.

The Bangalore Christian Healthcare Organisation Network (BCHON)

The Bangalore Christian Healthcare Organisation Network (BCHON) meeting was held at St. Philomena's Hospital, Bangalore, with 34 participants from 5 institutions, focusing on the topic "Burnout in the Healthcare World." The discussion highlighted burnout, first described by Herbert Freudenberger in 1974 and now recognised by WHO as a syndrome caused by unmanaged workplace stress, leading to exhaustion, cynicism, and reduced efficiency. With global prevalence ranging from 25–60% and Indian surveys reporting high levels of personal (47%), work-related (31%), and patient-related (35%) burnout, the session noted younger, female, unmarried professionals in challenging conditions as most vulnerable. The impact of burnout on healthcare workers, organisations, and patients was emphasised, and strategies for management were discussed at both organisational levels (staffing, work hours, workplace safety) and individual levels (mindfulness, yoga, physical activity), underlining the need for an integrated approach.

Future Plans

The Certificate Program in Strategic Management in Modern Healthcare is designed to empower healthcare administrators, students, and professionals with the knowledge and tools to lead effectively in today's dynamic healthcare environment. Conducted over 3 to 6 months in a flexible online or blended format, the course offers live interactive sessions, recorded lectures, and expert insights from hospital administrators, CEOs, and healthcare innovators. Participants will explore key topics such as operational efficiency, patient-centred care, technology integration, quality improvement, and leadership development.

Certificate Course on Accounting in Hospitals (Batch 3)

Organised by CMAI and St. John's Medical College, Bangalore, the online course was held from July 19 – August 16, 2025 (Fridays & Saturdays, 5–8 PM) for managers and accounts staff from mission hospitals. Fifty participants from CMAI, CHAI, EHA, and other Christian hospitals attended on a first-come-first-served basis. Key topics included hospital accounting basics, legal structures (Society, Trust, Company), banking practices, digital banking, investments, FCRA norms, tax laws, auditing, cost management, land and building transactions, and digitization. The sessions were led by experts from St. John's and mission hospitals. Participants received practical training to strengthen hospital financial management, and certificates were jointly awarded by CMAI and St. John's Medical College.

37th Healthcare Management Development Programme

The Administrators Section of CMAI conducted the 37th HMDP from 2nd to 13th June 2025, with 42 participants from 14 mission hospitals across India. The program focused on leadership, administration, governance, and sustainability in healthcare. His Grace Archbishop Peter Machado delivered the inaugural message. Devotions were led by Dr. Aby and team (BBH). Dr. Priya John (CMAI General Secretary) gave the felicitation.

Allied Health Professionals

AHP National Conference

The 20th CMAI Allied Health Professionals National conference was successfully conducted at Pagoda Resorts, Alleppey, Kerala on 29th and 30th November 2024. The two-day conference was attended by 80 participants from across the country.

The conference began with prayer by Regional AHP sectional secretary of Kerala Ms Ancy Ben Zacharia, followed by praise and worship from Believers Church Medical College team led by Ms Susan. The devotion was shared by Rev PL Johnson, he reflected on the theme the perfect peace from Ephesians 2:14, and reminded about the importance of being still to know God.

Followed by the sessions was the AHP Annual General Assembly, around 30 AHP Members were present for the AGM. The meeting presided by AHP Section Chairperson Mr Paul Patric Brown, Ms Ancy Ben Zacharia was appointed as the recording secretary, the meeting started with opening prayer by Mr Saroj Kumar Sahu. The agenda was approved, two names were mentioned for the Obituary Dr Ramu Ranadive and Dr Robert H Carman, Father Sijo Kunnel prayed for the departed souls and the bereaved family. Previous AGM minutes conducted along with the Biennial conference in Jabalpur on November 2023 were displayed, it was also circulated through email to all members. The AHP Secretary presented the report, the report was emailed to all and the displayed ppt touched upon the important highlights of the last year including recognition efforts under the new NCAHP, the decrease in the number of CEB course takers, receipt of 2617 AHP registration application and we issued 1700 registrations. 7 SEED (Students Empowering and Enriching Directive) programs, one CALL program and two CLUE (CMAI Laboratory Upskilling and Enhancement) program conducted under the leadership of the AHP Section.

The conference ended with closing prayer and benediction by Fr Shibu Puthenpurackal, Joint Director of Amala institute of medical sciences, Thrissur.

CMAI Training and Research Institute for Health Sciences

On 5th July by the grace of almighty the CMAI Training and Research Institute for Health Sciences has been dedicated and inaugurated by president of CMAI Dr Mathew Santosh along with GS Dr Priya John and Previous GS Dr Bimal Charles and Dr Vijay Aruldas, in the presence of more than 50 distinguished guests, the ceremony witnessed sharing of stalwarts on the vision, dream and way forward for the Saduperi property.

Central Education Board

CEB Annual Meeting was conducted in CSCR conference room Bagayam on 29th June 2024, 14 members present for the face to face meeting and the rest of the CEB members attended online, reports were received from 15 committees, and the rest of the CEB members joined online. Each convenor's presented their reports and had some fruitful discussions regarding the recognition issues and standardization the admission dates for all the two-year diploma courses.

- Ten Dialysis tutors successfully completed the 1-year Tutor Course conducted by the Dialysis Training Committee, the program was initiated by Mr Berry. Dr Priya General Secretary CMAI awarded the Certificates to the candidate in the presence of Mr Paul Patrick, Dr Ninoo George, Mr Berry and AHP Secretary at the convocation function at Kanyakumari on 25/06/24.
- In the academic year 2023-2024, a total of 497 students were registered in 30 different courses under 14 committees in 44 Hospital Training centres.
- I was part of the Stone Unveiling ceremony on 9th December 2024. The donors from Barbabas Aid UK visited Saduperi CMAI Training and Research Institute. The donors were happy with the quick progress in the construction.

On 5th July afternoon from 02:00 pm to 04:00 pm we have conducted the CEB meeting at CMAI TRIHS Conference hall, the hybrid form of meeting witnessed 14 members at the venue and rest of the members joined online, only two convenors sent the apologies. The Chairperson Dr Victoria Job welcomed the members and congratulated team CMAI for bringing the building into reality in just 18 months. The report of each committee presented and discussed on the recognition issue and AHP Secretary Mr Lyric Abraham updated the CEB about the recognition efforts and latest updates regarding the waiting for the final regulations from NCAHP to each state council.

CHAPLAINS

Exposure Visit for Theological Students, Ranchi

The Chaplains Section organized a two-day exposure visit for theological students of Navin Doman Theological College, Ranchi. The program included interactions with the YMCA Urban Slums Community Health Project and CNI St. Barnabas Hospital, offering students a firsthand experience of faith-based healthcare and community outreach.

Sessions focused on the integration of pastoral care in health settings, the Church's response to marginalization, and embodying compassion and justice in ministry. Students interacted with healthcare professionals, community workers, and patients, gaining insight into how pastoral presence contributes to holistic healing. This experience helped students understand the realities of suffering while strengthening their vision for ministry and affirming the transformative role of Church- healthcare partnerships.

15th National Conference of the Chaplains Section

The Chaplains Section of CMAI hosted the 15th National Conference of the Chaplains Section on the 23rd and 24th of October 2024 in the serene surroundings of Kodaikanal. A total of 31 participants including chaplains, pastors, and theological students were gathered under the theme "Perfect Peace" (Ephesians 2:14). The conference delved into the concept of peace within individual lives and broader society, with engaging sessions focusing on social reconciliation, family dynamics, and healing in the context of physical trauma such as amputation.

In addition to thought-provoking discussions, the conference included worship services, a Holy Communion celebration, group reflections, and a time of fellowship during a local sightseeing tour. The gathering proved to be spiritually enriching, fostering deeper connections among participants and equipping them with renewed vision to be peace-makers and healers within their communities.

Medical Mission Retreat

The Medical Mission Retreat was held on 3rd February 2024 at Indiranagar Methodist Church. The event was organized for the church members to learn about the present scenario of Christian mission hospitals in India and their challenges. It discussed how the Lord had helped those mission hospitals through His interventions in the service of medicine. This medical retreat initiated the church's support for the mission hospitals and medical care professionals who render their service.

SHAPES – Mental Health Training for School Teachers

9 August & 30 August 2025, Bathlagundu (Theni District) & Jayamkondam (Ariyalur District) As part of continued collaboration with the Catholic Health Association of Tamil Nadu (CHAT), the Chaplains Section launched SHAPES — Shaping Healthy Attitudes for Promoting Emotional Support. This initiative focused on mental health and emotional well-being of children and adolescents.

The training sessions equipped teachers to recognize early signs of emotional distress, address post-pandemic challenges, and create supportive classroom environments. Interactive methods such as games and visual aids were used to engage participants. I thank Ms. Gnancy and Mr. Santhosh for co-facilitating these impactful sessions.

CMAI & Tamil Evangelical Lutheran Church

The Chaplains Section of CMAI coordinated with TELC and the Ziegenbalg Missionaries Movement (ZMM), organized a four-day Health Awareness Training at the historic Ziegenbalg Spiritual Centre in Tranquebar from 13th to 16th February 2025. This training program was formatted to integrate spiritual commitment with health awareness, the training equipped missionaries from across Tamil Nadu for more effective service.

The program featured sessions on mental health, counseling, pastoral care, first aid, CPR, hygiene, and common medical conditions. Participants engaged in early morning prayer walks, worship, reflective discussions, and hands-on training. I facilitated sessions on healthcare in ministry and counseling techniques, emphasizing holistic care and emotional resilience.

Speakers such as Prof Dr John Prabhu, Dr Deepa, Ms Annie Christabel, and I provided essential skills and insights for field-based ministry. The training concluded with a commissioning service, affirming the call to heal with compassion and competence. Participants left renewed and better equipped for mission in diverse settings.

Healing Ministry Theme 2026

An online consultation was held to discuss the Healing Ministry Theme for 2026, attended by Rev. Dr. Asir Ebenezer (NCCI), Sr. Dr. Helen (CHAI), Dr. Priya (CMAI), and myself. Based on our deliberations, the theme “Rethink” was proposed, with a focus on physical health and holistic healing. This theme invites communities and institutions to re-examine existing approaches to care and embrace renewed models of ministry. Following discussions and approvals from the members of GB, the final Healing Ministry Theme for 2026 was confirmed on 25th July 2025: “Rethink to Reach Out” – Based on Mark 8:22–26. Scripture verse: “Again He laid His hands...”(v.25)

DOCTORS

National Conference of Doctors Section

The Christian Medical Association of India's Doctors Section held its National Conference in Aluva, Kerala, focusing on the theme "Perfect Peace." The three-day event began with an evening of fellowship and networking on November 21st.

Day two featured morning devotions led by Dr Bobby John, followed by Dr Rajeev Joy Nathan's welcome address emphasizing the gathering's spiritual and professional significance. Dr John C Oommen delivered the keynote address on "Perfect Peace," exploring peace through biblical perspectives and contemporary challenges. The day continued with sessions on Leprosy Care by Dr Helen Roberts and Dr Reeti Tiwari, and Medical Education trends by Dr Alen Thomas. The Annual General Meeting highlighted Section's activities and initiatives.

The final day included Dr Bobby John's devotion, followed by sessions on Telemedicine implementation by Dr Kevin and Christian Healthcare direction by Dr John C Oommen. The conference successfully balanced professional development with spiritual growth, featuring practical healthcare discussions alongside spiritual reflection and fellowship opportunities.

Key outcomes included strengthened professional networks, enhanced understanding of current healthcare challenges, and renewed commitment to Christian healthcare service. The conference concluded with a fellowship lunch, marking the end of a comprehensive program that effectively combined clinical education, spiritual elements, and community building.

CMAI - CMC DEdu Project

CMAI in collaboration with CMC DEdu, has made significant progress in establishing a dedicated distance education desk as part of its "Elevate Health: Empowering for Care" project, funded through the CCIH Small Grants program. Following the initial grant award, CMAI held an initial meeting with CMC DEdu to outline the requirements and clarify the roles of each organisation in the project. Through this meeting and subsequent online meeting, roles for both CMAI and CMC DEdu were clearly defined, establishing a foundation for ongoing collaboration. One of the first joint initiatives under this partnership is the digitization of the Fellowship in Nursing Management (FNM) program. In preparation for this, job descriptions were developed and recruitment for key roles took place based on these specifications. To formalise the partnership, an overarching MoU was established between CMAI and CMC DEdu, along with a project-specific MoU focused on the FNM digitization project. A detailed budget for the project has also been prepared, along with a financial forecast to support planning and sustainability. This initiative marks a critical step forward in CMAI's goal to improve healthcare access and training quality by delivering hybrid and distance learning modules, empowering healthcare workers in rural and underserved areas with relevant skills.

AGM of Doctors Section

The 125th anniversary celebrations of Kachhwa Christian Hospital, the oldest unit of the Emmanuel Hospital Association (EHA), were held on 17th February 2024. It was a privilege to be part of this momentous occasion. The celebration provided a valuable opportunity to engage with individuals who have faithfully committed themselves to the mission of Kachhwa Christian Hospital. Stories shared about past stalwarts—their sacrifices and unwavering dedication to God's calling—were deeply inspiring. The hospital's continued commitment to addressing the healthcare needs of the community was clearly evident. Its leadership and vibrant community foster an atmosphere of encouragement, drawing in young leaders to carry forward the legacy of medical mission.

Following the celebrations, Dr. Priya John, General Secretary of CMAI, along with a CMAI representative, visited the hospital. The visit included a tour of the facility, offering first-hand insight into the infrastructure and vital services provided. Interactions with the devoted staff, along with shared words of encouragement, proved to be a rewarding experience.

This 125th anniversary celebration stands as a powerful testament to Kachhwa Christian Hospital's rich history and its steadfast dedication to compassionate service. The enduring commitment of both past and present staff ensures that this institution will remain a beacon of hope and healing for generations to come.

All India Congress on Church in Mission (AICOCIM) 2025

The All India Congress on Church in Mission (AICOCIM) 2025, convened every decade by the Evangelical Fellowship of India (EFI), brought together Christian leaders, theologians, educators, and health professionals from across the country to reimagine the Church's role in mission within the changing social, political, and economic context of India.

This year, the Congress was held in Nagpur with the theme "The Church in Mission - Healing, Wholeness, and Hope" and the congress featured thirteen strategic tracks and plenary sessions addressing contemporary challenges - religious freedom, discipleship, education, healthcare, creation care, leadership, and justice. The event concluded with the formulation of a National Church Manifesto outlining the collective commitment of the Indian Church for the next decade.

Dr Abhijeet Sangma served as one of the co-facilitators for Track 9, titled "Healing & Wholeness: Mental Health, Healthcare & Compassionate Witness." This track addressed the urgent need for the Church to engage meaningfully with India's growing mental health and healthcare challenges through a holistic, Christ-centred response.

NURSES LEAGUE

Short Course on 'Fellowship in Nursing Management'

Short course on Fellowship in Nursing Management was conducted from 1st July to 30th October with blended learning model. 100 hours of online sessions by experts on general and nursing management and a course on bioethics was conducted. The participants had one week of practical exposure at CMC Vellore from 13th to 18th January 2025. 22 Participants had registered for the course. The Resource team included Nurse Leaders from mission, private and corporate settings. The Valedictory programme was held on 6th March. The feedback from participants and Resource persons was very good and encouraging.

SLM based FNM Programme:

CMAI in Collaboration with CMC distance education department has developed Self Learning Modules (SLM) for the Fellowship in Nursing Management. The modules were reviewed by experts. A MOU has been signed, and a dedicated academic coordinator is appointed for this purpose. This type of blended learning will be much more effective for the future batches of the FNM Programme. The course will begin from 1st April 2025. Registrations have begun for this course.

National NL Conference

The Conference of the Nurses League of CMAI, held from December 4th to 6th at AGLC, Hyderabad, was a significant event attended by 101 participants from 18 States and one Union Territory. The conference brought together nurses from 25 CMAI Member Institutions, both public and private sectors, fostering a diverse and enriching environment. The theme of the conference was same as the Healing Ministry theme of CMAI for this year "Perfect Peace."

- The devotions on the first and third day led us into meaningful reflections from the word of God. The conference commenced with an inaugural program featuring Dr. Samson Sujit Kumar Gaddam as the Chief Guest. In his keynote address, he emphasized the importance of achieving perfect peace for the body, mind, and soul.

A highlight of the conference was the "Lead like Jesus" encounter seminar, which was well-received by the participants. The session emphasised that we must not edge God out of our lives but exalt Him through our lives. The seminar delved into the transformative power of Jesus's being and doing habits, inspiring participants to live, love, and lead like Him.

The conference also included uplifting singing and testimony sessions, providing opportunities to witness God's faithfulness in various ways. Home group meetings facilitated meaningful connections and prayer support among participants. Additionally, fun activities were organized for home groups, fostering fellowship among junior and senior nurses alike.

National NL Conference

The following scientific sessions were insightful and thought-provoking.

- a. The session on "Enhancing patient safety through effective systems and processes" emphasized the importance of evidence-based practices and a strong safety culture to improve patient outcomes.
- b. The "Midwifery model of Fernandez Hospital" session highlighted the significance of mother-centered care, emphasizing the empowering principle of "let the mother be in charge for her delivery. All others do as she says and be the midwife she needs."
- c. The panel discussion on "Climate Change and Impact on Health – The Nurse's Role" shed light on the far-reaching consequences of climate change on global, national, and local level. The session underscored the crucial role of nurses in addressing this issue and encouraged the adoption of measures to mitigate environmental damage and combat climate change.
- d. The session on "Revolutionizing Health Care- The Impact of AI on Nursing Practice" explored the potential of AI in enhancing the quality and efficiency of patient care. The session highlighted how AI can be leveraged to prioritize tasks, save time, and deliver highly effective care.

The Annual General Meeting of the Nurses League, held on December 6th, chaired by Mrs. Mercy Quila, involved the presentation of reports of NL and its Boards. 33 members and 39 non- members were present for the AGM. Collaborative Research, participation of sectional secretaries in the conference were some of the matters that were raised during the AGM.

4. Awareness sessions for women of SGH group, mother-in-law's, men and adolescents on sex, gender, gender-based violence, response to gender-based violence and legal aspects of it was conducted.
5. Interface meetings were conducted with financial institutions to create linkages for the project.

Project Title: Building capacity in rural Uttar Pradesh to improve livelihoods and project capacity

Funded by: ELCA

Goal: The overall goal of the project is to build sustainable livelihoods for the poor and disadvantaged communities living in the rural area in Sukhlaganj block adjacent to St Catherine's hospital in Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh.

Update of the project:

- 1) One day Trade wise capacity building & technical training for SHG leaders, members and CMs (20 Participants in each batch) on Non-Agriculture (Tailoring, Grocery Shop, vegetable vending, pulses vending, basket making) on 14th May 2025.
- 2) One day Trade wise capacity building & technical training for SHG leaders, members and CMs (20 Participants in each batch) on Agriculture (Paddy, Wheat, Maize, Cane Sugar, cash crops and lentils) on 28th May 2025.
- 3) 12 awareness meetings were conducted among SHG members about various schemes from the govt. including Ayushman Bharat.
- 4) 6 awareness meetings were held in villages for unemployed & drop out youth to select short term vocational training such as computer operator, Tally, household electronic maintenance, General Duty Assistance, Emergency Medical Technician, Mobile Repairing, Income Generation Programme Activity, etc. for their livelihood.
- 5) 12 special sessions were conducted on maternal & child health once in a month during SHG meeting through Volunteers and project staff.

GDCI and CMAI Cleft Lip and Craniofacial Surgery Project.

German Dental Care Hood International have collaborated with CMAI through Scudder Memorial Hospital, Ranipet, to conduct Cleft Lip and Craniofacial surgery for 15 patients. Funds for the project has been extended, and 19 patients have benefitted from the initiative so far.

Objective of the project:

- a. To identify and screen individuals with cleft and craniofacial conditions within the hospital catchment area.
- b. To provide timely medical consultations to affected individuals, ensuring accurate diagnosis and treatment recommendations.
- c. To deliver surgical interventions to correct cleft lip and palate, craniofacial deformities and related anomalies.

Project Update: 9 patients have been operated upon in this period.
